
Shaping the future of LNG export in the US

Port Arthur LNG is poised to become the largest LNG export hub in Texas, delivering reliable energy from the Gulf Coast to support global energy security and U.S. leadership in natural gas. This \$25 billion investment in Southeast Texas creates thousands of jobs, boosts small businesses and generates lasting revenue for the community. Port Arthur LNG represents the belief that one Gulf Coast community can power the world while building a brighter future at home.

Since 2015, Sempra Infrastructure has invested over \$4.5M in nonprofits, schools and community-based organizations in Jefferson County, and anticipates approximately \$20 million in social investments through 2030 to support the health and well-being of the local region.







Advancing America's energy leadership

In 2025, we advanced one of the largest energy infrastructure projects in Texas, marking a year defined by steady construction progress, major achievements and growing visibility across the region. As work continued on Phase 1, teams delivered critical milestones that moved the project closer to bringing new U.S. LNG capacity online and advanced the Port Arthur Phase 2 project to a positive final investment decision.

2025 milestones:

- Phase 2 received non-FTA export authorization
- Completed a sale and purchase agreement with JERA for Phase 2
- Completed a sale and purchase agreement with ConocoPhillips for Phase 2
- Completed a sale and purchase agreement with EQT for Phase 2
- Phase 2 achieved a positive final investment decision
- The main cryogenic heat exchanger was delivered and installed in Train 1
- Both LNG storage tanks reached raised-roof milestones
- Completed work on the berm surrounding the project
- Wick drain and initial piling work for Phase 2 started
- Over 20 large deliveries received from the Marine Offloading Facility



The team has hired 133 permanent operations employees, and 74 of those roles are filled by local residents of Southeast Texas. Our internship program with Lamar State College Port Arthur hosted nine students last year, all of whom completed our hands-on LNG training and accepted full-time positions at Sempra Infrastructure after finishing the program.

Construction employees

In 2025, the Port Arthur LNG site provided construction related jobs for approximately 5,406 workers. Phase 1 created opportunities for 1,256 local employees, while Phase 2 supported 90 local workers, underscoring the project's role as a major driver of workforce growth and community impact.

Backpack program

Supporting local students beyond the school week

Every Friday during the school year, hundreds of students in Port Arthur ISD and all students in Sabine Pass ISD head home with more than just their weekend plans - they bring home meals, snacks and drinks that help bridge the gap while school is out. Through a \$133K partnership with the Southeast Texas Food Bank, the Backpack Program ensures that children don't face hunger over the weekend. A steady source of comfort and stability for families, this program reinforces the belief that no child in the greater Port Arthur area should worry about having enough to eat.

By December 2025, the program delivered 58K meals over 21 weeks, supporting 700 students. The impact is felt not only in fuller stomachs, but in better focus, improved well-being and a stronger sense of security that carries students into each new week. With support continuing through the end of the 2025-26 school year, the Backpack Program stands as a meaningful investment in increasing opportunity, supporting academic readiness and strengthening the overall health of the community.



A trusted after-school solution for local families

The Beyond Out of School Time (BOOST) program bridges a critical gap for working families whose schedules extend beyond traditional work hours. Through a \$60K partnership with the YMCA of Southeast Texas and the United Board of Missions, BOOST provides safe, dependable after-school care paired with hands-on learning in science, technology, engineering, the arts, and mathematics (STEAM) for elementary-age students. Launched in October, the pilot program offers families a reliable solution while giving children access to engaging academic enrichment, positive mentorship and a structured environment after the school day ends.

Building on the YMCA's established framework, the program delivers nightly academic and STEAM activities, social-emotional learning, organized physical activity and nutritious meals. BOOST is already showing strong early momentum, with consistent nightly attendance serving 15 to 18 students and reflecting growing community engagement. By offering temporary childcare subsidies that help reduce cost barriers, the program has doubled enrollment in YMCA after-school programming for Port Arthur ISD families, supporting workforce participation and strengthening family stability across the region.

Opening doors for the next generation of leaders

Sempra Infrastructure is helping expand access to STEM education, leadership development and essential life-skills training for young women across Orange, Beaumont and Port Arthur. Through a partnership with the Girl Scouts of San Jacinto Council, school-based programming was delivered across 13 campuses, reaching more than 3,000 elementary and middle school students. These hands-on learning experiences introduce young women to science, technology, engineering and math while building confidence, curiosity and leadership skills at an early age.

To ensure every student had the opportunity to participate, the investment also helped remove financial barriers by covering annual membership and program fees, allowing young women to remain engaged in year-round programming. Together, these efforts promote greater equity in education, strengthen early workforce readiness and empower students with the skills and self-assurance they need to pursue future academic and career success, creating lasting impact for each participant.

Hi-54 deep artificial reef project



From infrastructure to ecosystem

A \$125K partnership is helping bring new life to the Texas coast through the continued development of a 160-acre artificial reef located nine miles offshore near Sabine Pass.

Led by Friends of Sabine Pass, in collaboration with the Texas Parks & Wildlife Foundation, the project is strengthening marine ecosystems in a region where healthy habitat supports both biodiversity and the local community.

The reef expansion includes the deployment of 300 concrete pyramids and 100 cement plates, engineered to create long-term structure for fish, coral and other marine species. These additional structures will enhance habitat complexity and support the recreational fishing economy that is vital to coastal communities.

Construction began in August 2025, with full deployment expected by March 2026—marking a significant step forward in restoring and protecting the Gulf's natural resources for future generations.



Strengthening Food Security Across Southeast Texas

Food insecurity affects thousands of families across Southeast Texas, impacting students, seniors and working parents alike. At Port Arthur LNG, we believe that access to nutritious food is foundational to a strong and resilient community. In 2025, our team put more than \$383K toward social investment efforts that helped stabilize food access, support local families and strengthen the region's hunger-relief network.

Last fall, when the community faced a surge in food insecurity, Port Arthur LNG and Sempra Infrastructure mobilized quickly to help stabilize food access.

We deployed \$250K in emergency grant funding to the Southeast Texas Food Bank which enabled the food bank to secure multiple truckloads of emergency food boxes and tray pack kits, working hand in hand with community pantries to meet urgent demand across Jefferson County and beyond.

Renewal Roots

A community grant helped expand Renewal Roots, a neighborhood-focused program that restores safety, stability and pride for residents in Port Arthur and Beaumont. Organized by Chosen Generation Evangelistic Ministry, the initiative provides free yard care, debris removal and basic home-safety support for seniors, veterans and people with disabilities, while also offering hands-on training for individuals working to rebuild their lives.

Since launching in September 2025, Renewal Roots has supported 35 households, completed 140 service tasks and distributed 25 hydration readiness kits. The program has also helped two participants secure full-time jobs through their community service efforts.



STEM-E Summer Camp

The STEM-E Summer Camp expanded hands-on STEM learning for Port Arthur students by helping close academic gaps in math and science while building confidence, creativity and problem-solving skills. The program, organized by Strong Tower Ministries, served 41 students in third through sixth grades and offered interactive STEM and creative writing lessons supported by volunteers who contributed nearly 700 hours of mentorship. Through project-based activities, students explored complex concepts in ways that sparked curiosity and strengthened critical thinking. The camp ended with a student showcase attended by families and community members, celebrating student growth.



Communities in Schools -
Mental Health Support

Through the community grant program, Communities in Schools Southeast Texas (CISSET) received funding to expand school-based mental health services for students across the region. CISSET implemented individual and small-group counseling, crisis intervention and trauma-informed care to support students experiencing anxiety, depression, grief and behavioral challenges through evidence-based activities, including coping skills development, emotional regulation strategies and peer support. Through the program, educators reported stronger student readiness to learn, while families shared increased confidence in their children's ability to manage stress and everyday pressures. The initiative also helped strengthen campus capacity by building coordinated referral pathways and improving how schools respond to student mental health needs.

Sabine Pass ISD received funding to support hands-on, experiential learning across elementary, middle and high school programs. Middle school science classes received tools for water rockets, hydroponics lab equipment and engineering kits that help students test ideas, solve problems and work together. High school students are benefiting from enhanced program funding in culinary arts, cosmetology, media production, academic competitions and college and career readiness support. These programs expand access, spark curiosity and build confidence for students throughout the school district.



Students in Orangefield ISD are gaining new opportunities for career-connected learning in math and science through the EmpowerEd grant program. These grant resources provided graphing calculators and forensic science kits that help students visualize real-world scenarios, analyze data and apply concepts through collaborative investigations. These projects deepen STEM learning and give students meaningful experience with tools and practices used in high-demand fields.



Nederland ISD was awarded grant funding to expand practical learning across science, art and journalism programs. Funding provided resources such as reusable robotics kits, rotary motion equipment and laboratory tools that help students design, build and test projects using real-world data. Additional education grants supported a forensic science lab and new digital cameras and lenses for yearbook and journalism classes. These investments give students access to professional-grade tools and strengthen learning across the district.



Students at Hillcrest Christian Academy are gaining new early STEM opportunities through two grants that funded mobile classroom resources. The Maker Space Mobile Project Cart allows students to design, build and test engineering challenges such as bridges, ramps and pulley systems. The second grant award provided a Mobile STEM Station for Pre-K through second grade with reusable kits for activities like building roller coasters, experimenting with magnets and creating chain reactions. These tools support cross-curricular exploration and give students engaging ways to build early STEM skills.
