

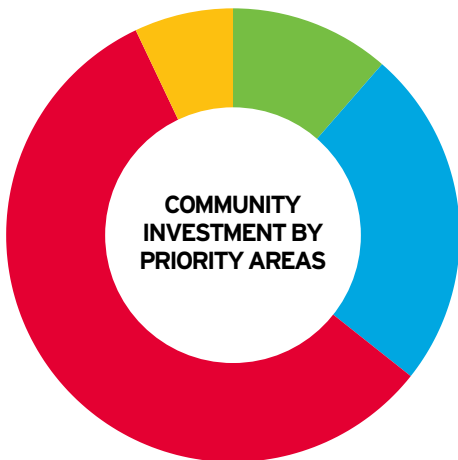
2024 community impact report



Driving advancement: economic and global impact

Port Arthur LNG is a natural gas liquefaction and export terminal currently under development in Jefferson County, Texas, with direct access to the Gulf of Mexico via the Sabine-Neches ship channel. This state-of-the-art facility is strategically positioned to enhance U.S. export capabilities while fostering economic growth locally. The Port Arthur LNG Phase 1 project is a joint venture between Sempra Infrastructure and ConocoPhillips, with Bechtel serving as the engineering, procurement and construction (EPC) contractor.

As part of our ongoing commitment to being a responsible and engaged neighbor, we distributed more than \$495,000 in social investment in 2024, impacting over 60 nonprofit and community organizations.

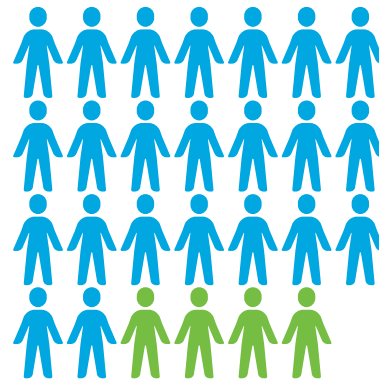

Connected for Impact

Port Arthur LNG fosters local economic growth by keeping area business owners and contractors informed through regular project updates, creating opportunities for them to get involved and participate. Local hiring is a top priority, with efforts such as job fairs, contractor outreach and workforce development initiatives designed to connect Southeast Texas residents with new employment opportunities.

Our partnerships with chambers of commerce, leadership and economic development programs in Port Arthur, Beaumont, Nederland and Orange strengthen this effort, supporting events and services that help small businesses grow and expand access to resources across the region.



A groundbreaking year

On March 15, the Port Arthur LNG Phase 1 project celebrated a significant milestone with a one-year post FID and groundbreaking celebration in Port Arthur, Texas.

While construction began shortly after the positive FID decision in March 2023, this celebration highlighted the project's momentum and the powerful impact it is driving locally, nationally and globally.

The local effects are significant, with economic advantages benefiting regional vendors, training initiatives and conservation projects throughout the Golden Triangle.

Environmental stewardship and sustainability



Committing to a more sustainable future

In 2024, we deepened our commitment to environmental stewardship and sustainability through the Environmental Champions initiative, a grant program that empowered local organizations to lead impactful projects focused on habitat restoration, beautification, environmental education and sustainable practices.

The Renewal Roots program, powered through one of the grant awards, showed how environmental care can drive meaningful community change. The program offers free landscaping for veterans, seniors and people with disabilities, transforming neglected yards into safe, welcoming spaces. The program by Chosen Generation Evangelistic Ministries goes beyond beautification - it's a powerful reminder that caring for the environment can uplift lives and strengthen communities.



Wetland restoration

We are proud to support the restoration of the J.D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area in partnership with Ducks Unlimited and the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. This vital effort improves wetland habitats by restoring levees, clearing invasive vegetation and enhancing water management to sustain migratory waterfowl and other wildlife.

With an investment from Port Arthur LNG's parent company, Sempra Infrastructure, Ducks Unlimited launched the first phase of this project in 2024, working to restore the wetland units and strengthen local ecosystems. This phase is expected to be completed in early 2025.

Education and workforce readiness

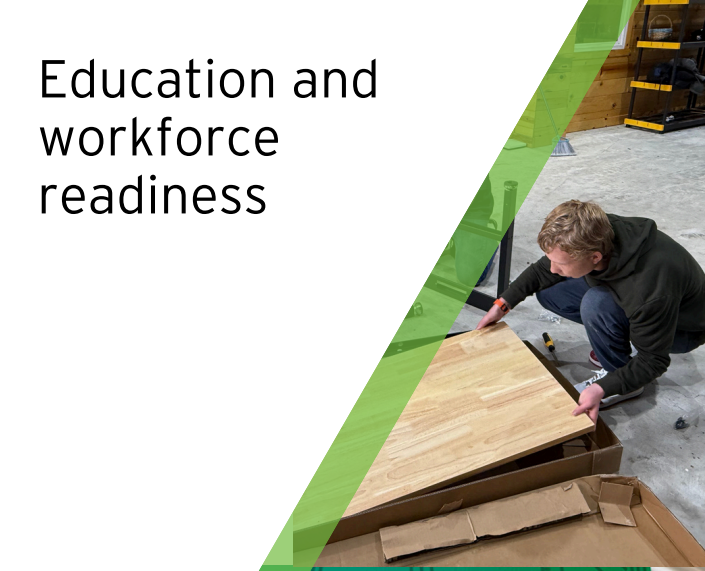
Investing in STEM excellence

The 2024 Innovative Educators initiative funded over \$95,000 for STEM projects in Sabine Pass ISD, Nederland ISD, Port Neches-Groves ISD and Woodrow Wilson Early College High School, fostering hands-on learning that connects academics to real-world applications.

Key projects in Sabine Pass ISD include:

- Egg Incubator Project: Students learned about biology and embryology by observing chicken egg development.
- Historical Headstone Restoration: Students use engineering software and research to restore headstones, combining history with STEM skills.
- Modernized Science Labs: Enhanced equipment enables advanced experiments in microbiology and physics.

These initiatives benefited 200 students by developing critical thinking, problem-solving and technical skills for future STEM careers.

In 2024, the Port Arthur City Council recognized Port Arthur LNG's commitment to workforce development through its welding and pipefitting training program with Bechtel and Port Arthur ISD.

At graduation, Bechtel provided protective equipment and apprenticeships to six graduates who earned NCCER certification. Their achievements highlight the impact of local career training, inspiring future students and strengthening the community.

Emergency preparedness and community safety



Strengthening communities

We prioritize safety and well-being by supporting programs that enhance community resilience. In partnership with the Southeast Texas Food Bank, we invested \$35,000 to the Backpack Program, which helps combat food insecurity by providing children with nutritious, easy-to-consume meals for weekends and school breaks.

During the 2024 school year, the program supported children in need by distributing 79,000 backpacks, 264,000 meals and 316,800 pounds of food. Through partnerships like this, Port Arthur LNG remains committed to investing in the health, safety and future of Southeast Texas families.



Investing in community safety

Through its Safe Communities initiative, Port Arthur LNG provided funding to 22 organizations in 2024 to strengthen safety and resilience across Southeast Texas. One of these programs includes the Port Arthur Junior Deputy Camp organized by Linda's Lighthouse, where local kids spent time with first responders and community leaders building trust, leadership skills and a deeper connection to their hometown.

From expanding access to wellness resources and supporting food security to enhancing emergency response efforts, these partnerships brought real support where it was needed most. Every grant reflected a shared commitment to helping communities prepare, respond and thrive.

Fighting against hunger

We are proud to highlight the remarkable efforts of our team in the ongoing fight against hunger in our community in 2024.

Thirty employees packed 440 food boxes at the Southeast Texas Food Bank, resulting in eight fully stocked pallets distributed to local senior citizens throughout October. Their dedication extended to volunteering at the United Board of Missions, where they helped restock and organize the food pantry to ensure neighbors had access to essential supplies.

During hunger action month, our employees collected an impressive 4,000 pounds of spaghetti noodles and sauce. These contributions, distributed by the United Board of Missions, helped serve 500 individuals each month, reinforcing our commitment to community well-being and food security.

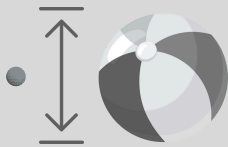

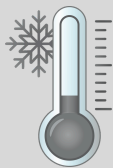
Fun facts about LNG and the project

1/600 comparison



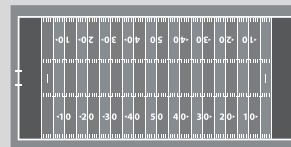
Did you know liquefied natural gas (LNG) occupies 600 times less space than its gaseous form? This significant volume reduction makes LNG more efficient for storage and global transport.

Super cold

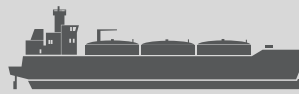


To make LNG, the natural gas is cooled to approximately -260°F (-162°C). That's super cold, much colder than anywhere on Earth! The gas turns into a liquid because of this.

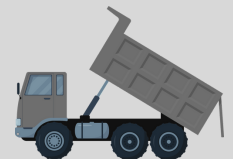
LNG carrier size



A 1,132-foot LNG carrier is roughly 3 football fields long! This will be the largest carrier at our facility.



Huge excavation effort



For the Port Arthur LNG project, over 1.6 million cubic yards of soil stabilization materials have been used, roughly equivalent to filling 498 Olympic-sized swimming pools.
